In collaboration with the Department Chairs of each discipline, teachers were given the option this year to use a project-based assessment in place of a traditional exam and the creativity of some of the teachers has been extraordinary.

Unfortunately, due to restrictions placed on in door gatherings, we were forced to cancel the Junior Semi Formal which is traditionally held in February. The Final Countdown

The next few months will see, hopefully, a slow return to normal. We hope and we pray!

We will still have choices to make over the next few months.

- To get the vaccine when it becomes available
- To continue to follow the COVID guidelines of masks, distance, no large gatherings and the choice of virtual or in person learning

- Maybe for some it is the final opportunity to be a good citizen by following the protocols. It is obvious by the news reports and things we hear in school that some folks choose not to follow the protocols. New Years parties, large social gathering, etc..
- What is the justification for not following guidelines?
 - We have a right.
 - We want our kids to have a normal senior year.
 - We believe that what we do does not matter.
 - The mask is uncomfortable (yes, it is!)
 - There are lots of attempted justifications.

It may be that some folks are missing the point.

- The time we are in is <u>not normal</u> and cannot be made into normal.
- The school year is <u>not normal.</u>
- The athletic seasons are <u>not normal</u>.
- The senior spring for the Class of 2021 may not be normal.

Having parties and large gatherings will not help to make things normal. Not wearing a mask will not make things normal. It will only make things worse and widen the divide between those of us who follow the protocols and those of us who don't.

Some folks will say life during this pandemic is not fair. That is obvious, but this is not the first time students in high school or anyone else have faced not normal times.

- If you graduated from high school during the years of 1941 through 1945 there was a pretty good chance that the service was your next stop, fighting the Nazis or fighting in the Pacific.
- If you graduated from high school in the 50s, 60s or 70s, until President Reagan and Congress abolished the draft in the 80s, there was a chance that you might have been drafted and sent to Korea, or later Vietnam, to fight for our country. My draft number was 192. (You might say that this only affected guys, but for every male drafted there was a family, wife, or girlfriend left behind who had the terrible time of worrying while their loved one was away.)
- Imagine graduating from high school in the 1930s during the Depression with the understanding that most of the work force was out of work.
- Imagine being a teenager between 1861 and 1865 during the Civil War and spending a few days in Gettysburg in July 1863.

Times have always been hard and rarely are times "normal".

I guess the point of all of this is that it may be time for students and the rest of us to move forward.

It may be time for kids to come to school, if possible. A senior class needs to be together, in school. (I understand this is not possible for some, but it is very possible for others.)

It is time to work out your future as best as possible and be grateful for the gifts you have.

I guess it is time to stop trying to make things normal. It is time to begin doing what is best for all of us.

I keep hearing the phrase, "we are all in this together".

Maybe we all need to hear it again, maybe several times more.




