Dear Spartan Community:

VAPING

I share with you information that, unfortunately, is turning into an epidemic, not only in New Jersey schools, but across the country – vaping and electronic cigarettes.

As what has become a sign of the times in modern society, the laws cannot keep up with technology. School policy, in some cases, has to become reactionary to societal trends, as opposed to pro-active. I want to share with you today how we at DePaul Catholic High School are responding to this situation.

If you "vape" in school or on school grounds, it is treated as a violation of the substance abuse policy and a first offense will trigger a mandatory drug test (before you can be readmitted to school), disciplinary action, and, referral to counseling services. A second offense involving e-cigarettes will result in a permanent removal from the school community.

Some many ask, "Why a drug test?" The answer to this is because the school administration has no idea what is contained in the e-cigarette and, as I have witnessed personally, the contents of the vape may be an illegal or controlled substance. As we already know, there are negative health effects to using nicotine and, as we are finding out, other substances can be added to the vape pens. The use of these JUUL devises are compact, they emit no smell and no smoke, and can be used almost undetectably.

Restrictions are in place in New Jersey for youth access to these materials in a retail setting. The sale/distribution of electronic smoking devices to a person under age 21 is prohibited (N.J. State 2A:170-51.4(a)(2) (2018) and 2C:33-13.1(a) (2018)


