American Legion Auxiliary (ALA) Girls State program is among the most respected and selective educational programs of government instruction for U.S. high school students. It is a participatory program to develop young women as future leaders grounded in patriotism and Americanism. Female high school students who have completed their junior year are competitively selected based on scholastic, leadership, and service accomplishments.

At Girls State, participants learn about the political process by electing officials for all levels of state government and actively running a mock government. Due to Covid restrictions, this year's session will be held virtually.

Following the formation and success of The American Legion's Boys State program, the ALA developed a similar citizenship training program in order for high school girls to have the same opportunity. The first Girls State was conducted in 1937 and since 1948 has been a regular part of the ALA's better citizenship programs. Girls State sessions were held in all fifty states and the District of Columbia.

Amanda Gryzmolowicz, Class of 2007

Gryzmolowicz said she knew Pfizer was well positioned to create an mRNA vaccine quickly. As a senior manager in research informatics in the vaccine unit, she knew the company was already well positioned to quickly develop an effective vaccine.

From the moment the effort began, Gryzmolowicz said, it has been "24/7". There's always someone working on it.

During the past year, Gryzmolowicz said there were moments when the importance of their mission sunk in.

It really hit Gryzmolowicz in December when the Pfizer vaccine was about to head across America.

"As soon as the news came out, texts, phone calls, emails from family and friends," Gryzmolowicz said, expressing congratulations and thanks.

Soon Gryzmolowicz was watching TV and saw trucks carrying vaccine doses rolled out from Pfizer's manufacturing facility in Michigan. "I really felt like, wow, we just had such an impact on this world," she said.

The sense of pride showed through the following Monday, Gryzmolowicz said, when she was on a video conference call with co-workers. "Everyone was just glowing," she said. "I've never seen such big smiles."

Then in January, Gryzmolowicz, 32, got to take her 89-year-old grandmother, Lorraine Cannarella, to get her first vaccination dose at a New Jersey state vaccination site at the old Modell's Center in Woodland Park.

Gryzmolowicz said she was so grateful to get Cannarella protected against COVID-19. She joked that she barely minded that her grandmother received a Moderna shot that day. "My nana is one of the most important people in my life."

While at the vaccine site, Gryzmolowicz wore a Pfizer scarf and facemask that read "Science Will Win."Two older gentlemen came up and asked her if she worked at the pharmaceutical giant. She said yes. "Well, thank you so much for your contribution," she recalled one telling her, "It was just so wonderful."

Gryzmolowicz grew up in West Milford, New Jersey. She attended DePaul Catholic High School in Wayne and then earned a bachelor's degree in biology with a chemistry minor from Ramapo College in Mahwah. She still lives in Passaic County. She got her first job at Pfizer at the recommendation of Ramapo College Prof. Dr. Paramjeet Bagga. "I found in her a unique ability to recognize the problem to be solved," Bagga said of Gryzmolowicz.

"She had the most organized and professional approach." Bagga's expertise is bioinformatics — Ramapo College established first bioinformatics major in the U.S. in 2002 — and he said Gryzmolowicz was clearly cut out for the field. "The field is very interdisciplinary," Bagga said. "It focuses on data applying data science, computational

concepts to solve biological problems." He added: "That's what this vaccine's all about."




