Expect More Of Yourself

I have always enjoyed attending high school athletic contests. Recently, I have noticed a growing number of contests that end, whether in victory or defeat, with people, especially adult fans, being angry and or upset. It has taken some of the fun out of watching the

game, as I now have to listen to the anger and the yelling in the stands, by the fence or in the gym. I thought this happened only at pro-games, not high school.

Why the anger?

Playing time, perceived bad calls by the coach or the game official, unsportsmanlike conduct by one or both teams, parents worried about their child's potential athletic scholarship, discipline issues, listening to reporters, reading the online forums, etc.

As a retired football and track coach of 30 years, I believe I may have a little insight to help folks **enjoy** the game a bit more.

A side note:

Much of what is listed below is not original thinking by me. Some of it is paraphrased from an article I read a few years ago or from speaking with student-athletes.

I believe in the words below.

7 Ways Parents Can Help Their Kids In Athletics

- 1. Praise performance, not outcome. You want to complement a kid for positive qualities like playing hard, staying positive, maintaining composure, never quitting, etc. <u>The athlete who masters these qualities will eventually be the one who succeeds.</u>
- 2. Complementing kids too much for winning teaches them that winning is all that matters, and by default losing disappoints you.
- 3. Don't always talk about sports at home. Let your kid bring it up first most of the time. Let your home be a place of <u>peace</u>, <u>positivity</u>, <u>and mental recovery</u>.
- 4. Be positive and supportive. 9 out of 10 times, this is what your kid would like. They do not need another coach or critic at home.
- 5. If you read the forums, newspapers, rankings, box scores, don't talk about it with your kid.
- 6. Know your role. Players play. Coaches coach. Umpires umpire. Parents parent. There should be very little, if any, overlap between them.
- 7. When in doubt, back away a bit. This is tough to do, but it is often the right thing to do, especially when you know your kid is already serious or stressing about the sport.

Note:

Most kids, no matter how old they are, want to make their parents proud. Kids are keenly aware of their parent's judgments and opinions.

Know this- you have the power to help them or hurt them more than anyone else in the world.

You can be the one who sets the example suggested above.

Enjoy the game and your child's athletic gift from God!





Field Trip To Montclair Museum of Art submitted by the Art Department

The Fine and Performing Arts Honor Society recently visited the Montclair Museum of Art, receiving a guided tour of one of the current exhibitions, *Constructing Identity in America (1766-2017)*. Photographs, works on paper, mural art and three-dimensional installations were

Impeachment Trials

Mr. Cook's Constitutional Law class studied the process and history of impeachment trials in the United States, as part of its unit on Article I of the Constitution. To wrap up the unit, the students conducted a mock impeachment trial in a fictional scenario -- with lawyers, witnesses, and other roles chosen by a random name generator. In the end, the accused party was found guilty on 3 of 4 charges and automatically removed from office, but was not barred from future service (an optional punishment that may be handed down in an impeachment trial). Different vote results on each charge demonstrated the detailed interest with which the student jurors (representing the Senate) approached the case, and, considering their minimal time for preparation in randomly-assigned roles, the students did a terrific job.





Footsteps of My Father submitted by Mrs. Bullman

Sr. Jeanne and Mrs. Bullman attended the viewing of the New Jersey Premiere of "Footsteps of My Father" on Monday, April 1, 2019, at the New Jersey Jewish Film Festival. The screening was at the College of St. Elizabeth in Morristown, NJ. Pastor Chris Edmonds, who is featured in the documentary, and Stanlee

Stahl, the Executive Vice President of the Jewish Foundation for the Righteous, spoke after the film was shown.

"This film, produced by the Jewish Foundation for the Righteous, recounts the courageous act of Master Sergeant Roddie Edmonds, who was captured by the Germans during the Battle of the Bulge. As the highest-ranking officer in the Stalag IXA POW camp, Nazis ordered Edmonds to identify Jewish soldiers in his unit so that they could be separated from the other prisoners. Edmonds refused, responding, "We are all Jews here," thereby saving the lives of approximately 200 Jewish soldiers. The film, told through the lens of Pastor Chris Edmonds, Roddie Edmonds' son, is narrated by Ted Koppel."



She has been active in Holocaust and prejudice reduction training for over 20 years in both her work in her parish and at De Paul Catholic High School.
