My Child is Devastated!

I mean no disrespect to truly devastated students, but the title of this article is a phrase I generally hear several times a day. The phrase above, to me, means that there has truly been a terrible, possibly irreparable, event in the child's life. The phrase is serious.

Most of the time, when I hear a person use the phrase, they really mean their child is a bit disappointed or they are temporarily upset. Obviously, this is only one person's (mine) opinion, but it does get me to thinking about the next 3 weeks for students from DePaul who are graduating, or hanging out with graduates.

While graduation is a happy time for most students, there are some seniors and friends who will not enjoy the next few weeks. They may find themselves faced with having to makes choices about alcohol use, vaping, possibly drugs or intimacy. These are tough decisions that many of your kids may have to make. Some decisions they are about to make, for good or bad, may be life altering.

How can parents (as they worry about the next few weeks for their child) actually help their child?

Setting some new, or maintaining the boundaries already in place, may help your child get safely through these days and weeks. All kids like boundaries, though they will never admit it, as boundaries offer clear ideas about the do's and don'ts of successful living.

- Maintaining curfews (with some flexibility), saying no to overnight trips (even if you took part in an overnighter in high school).
- Not hosting parties with alcohol, even if you use the excuse ("I take their keys so they can't drive home"). Kids have a second set of keys.

I can offer more ways to help, but I think we all get the picture.

Maybe your child doesn't really want to "go wild" or experiment with something new and they are just looking for a way out. You can provide the out. Of course, your child may yell and scream and be devastated, but you might have saved your child from an embarrassing moment, or worse, just by you saying no to an outlandish request.

This time of year is tough for parents of high school graduates, but you do not have to give in to all the requests made by your child. It is okay to say no, even if your parents said yes to all your requests when you were in high school. You are not being a hypocrite, you are being a parent.
