Our Seniors will graduate tonight. Some are the first child to graduate, others the last, some are in the middle of the family.

When a DePaul family watches their final child graduate it is a night of some conflict for the parents. Of course there is the feeling of a job well done by mom and dad, the other is the sense of finality that this portion of their lives as parents has ended. No longer will DePaul be a daily part of their lives. The parents will, I hope, always stay connected with DePaul, but the daily connection is over.

My brothers and I attended DePaul in the late 60s and 70s. My parents, although both working, were continuously connected. They attended report card night, Back to School Night, my dad worked Bingo, my mom volunteered in the cafeteria, they chaperoned dances and, of course, attended all our games. They held us accountable for our grades and our actions and we paid a price if we did not put forth our best effort. They did not blame others when we messed up.

My parents were just like most parents today: connected, motivating, disciplined and always setting a positive example.

Graduation night for parents is a night to continue the process of letting go. At graduation practice we remind the students to thank those who have helped them get to this night. We remind students to thank the teacher, the advisor, the coach, the Sister, the priest and all who have helped them and supported them. We ask the students to give their parents a gift.

A gift?

A gift we call..... the gift of time.

All parents know that as kids grow older we see them less and less as they move on. The greatest gift a child can offer to their parent is the gift of time.

On graduation night, after the ceremony ends, we suggest that the students spend the evening with parents and family, offering family the gift of time. We suggest the family go to dinner, have a family gathering, that they go visit grandma and not look at their watch worried about missing something with their friends.

<u>The greatest Project Graduation is spending the evening with family...the</u> <u>entire evening.</u>

Parents should hope for this and expect this, and should be disappointed if the graduates choose friends over family. Parents deserve the evening with their graduate.


We have spoken about this to the seniors at graduation practice for many years and many students have followed our suggestions and had a wonderful evening....with family. I hope this year's class does the same.

The sound and quality may not be perfect as this streaming service is meant for sporting events only. However, it will give you an opportunity to view the ceremony from the comfort of your home.






Msgr. James H. O'Rorke

A native of Ireland, Msgr. O'Rorke was ordained on June 18, 1961 at All Hallows Seminary in Dublin, Ireland. His first assignment was at St. Andrew Parish, Clifton. He then served at DePaul Catholic High School in Wayne as a theology teacher and chaplain. From 1975 to 1976, he was assistant director of DePaul and then in 1976 to 1981, he served as director. He was appointed as the first pastor of St. Jude the Apostle in Hamburg, when it was raised to parish status in 1981. In 1988, he was named pastor of St. Vincent Martyr, Madison, until being named pastor of Our Lady of the Valley, Wayne in 1993, where he remained until he retired in 2003.

Congratulations To Our AP Scholars!

Every fall, the AP Program recognizes high school students who have demonstrated outstanding college-level achievement through their performance on multiple AP Exams. AP Scholar Awards come in different levels and types. See the criteria here:

AP Scholar: Granted to students who receive scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exam

AP Scholar with Honor: Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams

AP Scholar with Distinction: Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams

National AP Scholar: Granted to students in the United States who receive an average score of at least 4 on all AP exams taken, and scores of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams.

We are so fortunate to announce that for 2020, 20 of our DePaul students were announced as AP Scholars, 4 were announced as AP Scholars with Honor, 6 were announced as AP Scholars with Distinction, and one was announced as a National AP Scholar.

These honors are based on tests taken in 2020. The 2021 scores have not yet been released.
