About 34,000 Commended Student throughout the nation are being recognized for their exceptional academic promise. Although they will not continue in the 2021 competition for National Merit Scholarship awards, Commended Students placed among the top 50,000 scorers of more than 1.5 million students who entered the 2021 competition by taking the 2019 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT). Wedding Turns into DePaul Reunion



News From The Theology Department

The Theology department is busy at work with beginning their service projects, diving into the curriculum and working on extra projects! The Peer Ministers have been busy planning for our upcoming grade level retreats. They have been assigned new students to DePaul to mentor. These hardworking DP leaders have already shown their dedication to DP as they have led our opening Mass and prepared the Mass of St. Vincent DePaul on Monday.

In the classrooms, Mrs. Bullman's sophomores are working on their "Creation Projects" which will depict their interpretations and understandings of the Book of Genesis. Students are becoming quite creative making their own movies, storyboards and presentations to show their understanding.

Mrs. Bullman's seniors are studying Social Sin and the introduction to Catholic Social Teaching. They have examined societal issues we confront today, and detailed how they are addressed using the "Two Feet of Christian Justice", which explains how the Works of Mercy and Social Action can be applied.

The Class of 2024 is learning what it means to be in a full relationship with God, understanding that material objects are meaningless. They spent time in the chapel this week doing motivational meditation, to help deepen their thinking as they work on assignments reflecting who they are and who they want to be (keyword is WHO, not WHAT). Using their creativity, Ms. Sevean's classes are working on either a video or slides in addition to oral presentations to get their points across. The freshmen also created short videos for Preakness Healthcare in Wayne recalling their favorite moment or memory with a grandparent to help them celebrate Grandparent's Day!

The eighth grade class is beginning their journey into the Bible. They have already read about The Fall of Man and will continue exploring Sacred Scripture throughout the year. A focus will also be put on prayer life and learning various prayers as well as living the Ten Commandments.

The juniors are working on Sacraments and writing individual prayers and Ms. Bock's Senior classes have just presented their Powerpoint presentations on the effects of Social Sin in today's society. Off to a great school year start!


