happening here!


Our students are actively working on their studies, ranging from Creation to The Commandments, and more!



DePaul Catholic's foray into Engineering began in 2013 when two of the best A+ Certification students desired a greater challenge than simply dealing with break-fix technology. It was at that point we entered the Maker Movement, loosely defined as a technology-driven do-ityourself culture. Our first adventure was to hack a table and make an interactive touch-screen computer. The two young men, already well-versed in woodworking and construction techniques, learned about infrared and haptic technology to convert a 42" television into an interactive multi-touch table driven by a repurposed laptop. It took us nearly three months to accomplish the



task to our own degree of satisfaction, but once complete, we were ready to move on.

Five years later, DePaul Catholic's curriculum offerings in Engineering include **Introduction to Engineering Design (IED)**, a largely electronics project-based course, and **Honors Engineering 1 and 2.** Honors Engineering 1 picks up where IED left off with structural, mechanical, and computer science-based design. Engineering 2 is a mechatronic-based course, focused on robotics – computer systems for control, sensory feedback, and information processing.

Rounding out the Engineering department, are two new courses this year: **Design for 3D**

Printing and **Interactive 3D Design**, both of which use industry-standard development environments to open the DePaul Catholic students to the robust, creative world of 3D.



Science Field Trip

The DePaul Science Department attends special events in the area to stay current, keep material relevant, and connect classroom with real life. We will be attending the Gulliver's Gates exhibit in midtown New York, which is a collection of miniature interactive and animated models of places from around the world. An artist
