On Thursday, October 4th, DePaul had its annual visit from representatives of the Tri-County Scholarship Fund. Tri-County was established almost forty years ago, and has awarded \$27,000,000 since then in Catholic school scholarships to students from the Paterson Diocese's three counties.

DePaul currently enrolls forty-eight students who have received Tri-County Scholarships, scholarships totaling almost \$200,000 per year. Many of them joined our visitors for a reception in our Information Commons.

This year's visit included remarks from the Tri-County trustees in attendance, some "networking chats" whereby some of our Tri-County students enjoyed informal exchanges with our guests about careers, and tours of the school led by our Tri-County students where the trustees had a chance to see DePaul in operation.

All in all, this was a most successful day, and we look forward to welcoming Tri-County back again next year.

# Another Midnight Run - October 20th



### **Technology News**

DePaul Catholic's 1:1 Tablet PC Program piloted in 2003 with a select group of students and all staff. The then cutting-edge Tablets by today's standards were clunky — weighing in at just over six pounds apiece. Students were issued their Tablets as a freshman and graduated with the same Tablet PC four years later. The construction of the Tablet made in-house repairs possible through the IT Office.

Well, we've come a long way baby! Acknowledging the volatility of the consumer technology market, Sue Parler, the Technology Coordinator put forth a plan for a two-year, rather than four-year technology renewal program. New Tablet PCs are issued to all freshmen, collected at the conclusion of their



sophomore year, and then all juniors receive new next generation Tablet PCs. The thinking behind the plan was three-fold: 1) Stay of the cutting edge, 2) Better assurance of reliable and available technology for classroom use, and 3) The newer Tablets are shipped out for repair rather than repaired in-house, alleviating the strain on the IT Staff.

Now in the third year of implementation, Parler could not be happier with the transition. "Students, especially seniors, have a tool that is fully functional. On average, I get three or four students to coming into the IT Office during open hours and most of their issues can be handled within minutes. Our entire school is using an industry standard, Microsoft Surface Tablet, with Office 2016, and access to numerous Adobe and Autodesk programs. At one point, we led the technology revolution to 1:1 computing, but there came a time, we were looking into the taillights of others that had surpassed us. Well, we are now back as the front-runners, with our staff and students doing some amazing work and honing authentic 21st Century Skills."


