The fun of working in a high school is, of course, working with kids and parents to help them both move forward.

It was great to see our parents this week as they stopped by school for parent teacher conferences. The conferences are about both sides gathering the information needed to best educate the students. Sometimes parents are surprised to get certain information about their child and teachers always welcome information from parents to help bring clarity to questions about academic performance. Without information from both sides, the student will not receive the best possible education we can provide. It is vital that parents stay connected to their child's progress, not just on conference day but everyday.

I still firmly believe that kitchen table homework works as parents can view and guide their child when necessary. A closed bedroom door with the student studying (maybe) may not work for all. The kitchen table approach does work for all. In regard to the kitchen table, the table is a great place for family discussions, disagreements, resolutions and celebrations.

No one is too busy to say there is no time for kitchen table talk with their family. We make time for other things. We need to always make time for kitchen table talk. And of course, the children are not excused until the adults are finished eating. Simple rules can go a long way.

I am especially interested in observing the seniors here as they are well into the college admissions process. Some of the kids have positioned themselves over the past 3 years to be accepted into the colleges of their dreams. This was done through classwork, homework, sacrifice and toughness. Other seniors are still working towards that goal and sadly some seniors are now seeing the fruit of having not worked to their capacity over 3 years. There is still time, but their college choices are a bit more limited.

This is an important message for parents. Colleges look at all grades from high school. Getting off to a slow start in 9th and 10th grade can lead to a painful senior year of watching friends being accepted into college while your child waits and waits.

A suggestion for all. <u>Homework every night</u>. Understand that academics is forever while sports and activities are only temporary. Help your child prioritize their high school life with that in mind and things will probably go well.

And parents, being demanding of your children in academics is necessary and important. Yes, they may get angry with you, but in the end they will respect you for giving them strong direction. Strong direction however is not just saying: "you have to do better". It is helping your child gather the tools to achieve that goal. Kitchen table homework. Curfews. Stay at home nights and okay to go out nights. And please, never accept less than your child's best effort. Effort is the key because all students have the ability to give their best effort. However, the outcomes will never be the same for all. Effort is the key to successful living

And please... do not use the phrase "boys will be boys" to accept less than your son's best effort. This hurts your son more than you realize.

Successful parenting is exhausting....but isn't that what you signed on for?

The students created individual sleeping spaces and participated in spiritual reflections through meditation in the chapel. Donated foods were all the participants ate, and monetary contributions were earmarked for 3 of our 5 Midnight Runs, where our students will go into New York City and feed the poor. This is a vital part of our school's mission to serve!



DePaul has been blessed to have Fr. Chris Han join us as Chaplain. Fr. Chris immediately began engaging with students and has been such a welcome addition, especially to the Theology Department. Each Theology class will have the opportunity to learn about Mass through an interactive experience with Fr. Chris. The classes have already begun their instructional Masses with Fr. Chris, which has gotten off to a wonderful start. "Student voluntolds", as Fr. Chris calls them, either volunteer or are chosen by Fr. Chris to participate as an
