Tuition Set for School Year 2021-2022

Our Administration has recommended, and our Board has approved, a small increase of \$200 in DePaul's tuition for the upcoming school year, 2021-2022. This means that next year's tuition will be \$14,400. Fees will remain the same.

We do this with considerable reluctance. We know that our families make real sacrifices to send their children to DePaul, and we work to make the cost as manageable as possible. This year, for example, we froze the tuition, with no increase from last year. And our tuition, even with this bump, is less than almost all of the other Catholic high schools in our area. But our expenses continue to go up, and so we need this small increase to remain vital.

We appreciate the confidence our parents have shown in us. The greatest compliment anyone can give to another is to trust that someone to help raise their child. Our parents have our continuing promise that we'll do all that we can to justify their trust in us.

Last Wednesday was the final game for Coach John McKenna as Head Football Coach at DePaul Catholic High School.

He helped a lot of kids while at the same time he won a lot of games. Quite the combination.

All successful Head Coaches have a certain way they go about their business.

- · They work harder than anyone else.
- · They love their players.
- · They are loyal to their players.
- · They are demanding of their players, both academically and athletically.
- · They prepare their players both mentally and physically for the next contest.
- · They make in game decisions that work.
- · They trust their players.
- · They allow their assistant coaches to grow in experience.

Sounds like a good boss in a successful company or business.

During my time as a student and teacher I have had the honor to play or coach for 4 great head coaches.

I played for Coach Keil. He taught me about preparation, toughness, execution, avoiding mistakes and the importance of team. He also taught me that always studying and learning new things about the game was very important. In 1970 we were successfully throwing the ball from a 4 receiver set 20 or more times a game when the rest of the football world was still in a cloud of dust.

My first coaching job was for Coach Jack Jones beginning in 1977. Coach Jones taught me the value of preparation, intensity, tenacity and <u>patience</u>. If they can't stop it, keep running the same play. He basically taught me how to coach. He taught why athletics is a great teaching tool for all young people.

My next job was as an assistant coach to Coach Joe Lennon for 23 years. Coach Lennon gave me the opportunity to take control of the defense as a coordinator and always showed trust in my evaluations and game day judgment. He allowed the coach in me to flourish. Even today his players continue to attend games and offer their support to DePaul Catholic.

I had the honor to work with Coach McKenna for 5 years before he took over as head coach. John took the qualities of Keil, Jones and Lennon and blended them together and went on to great success winning games. His greatest success, however, was caring for his players and directing them to college. His ability to teach life skills and the rules for success are timeless.

DePaul has been blessed to have had many great coaches in all of our sports programs. These folks have had a tremendous, positive impact on the lives of so many young people.

It is my honor to have learned from all of them.

I am a lucky guy.

Drew Beebe- Clark Amongst 1,464 Top High School Seniors Awarded Full Four-Year Scholarships and Admission to Top Colleges Through the National Nonprofit QuestBridge Program

DePaul Catholic is extremely proud to announce that our



student, Drew Beebe-Clark, was amongst a group of 1,464 QuestBridge Finalists that matched with Davidson College in North Carolina. The application process is very competitive and rigorous. Drew was one of 6,885 students chosen out of 18,500 qualified candidates that were named Finalists. This year, QuestBridge matched with 1,464 Finalists, who are recognized as Match Scholarship Recipients. Drew is awarded a full four-year scholarship that covers the full cost of attendance, including tuition, room and board, books, supplies and travel expenses.

This year's Match Scholarship Recipients come from 48 states, including the District of Columbia, as well as the territories of Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, and Puerto Rico. These outstanding high school seniors have an

average unweighted GPA of 3.93, and 94% are in the top 10% of their graduating class. Of the students who reported standardized testing, 82% scored above 1260 on the SAT and 84% scored above 27 on the ACT.

"The achievements of our 2020 Match Scholarship Recipients are particularly exceptional in the midst of a year marked by challenging circumstances." said Ana McCullough, CEO and Cofounder of QuestBridge. "The fact that our college partners awarded a record number of scholarships this year bolsters our hope for a brighter, more equitable future." Drew says he is so honored and proud to attend Davidson College, as it was his top choice. Davidson is a very competitive liberal arts college in Davidson North Carolina.

The ongoing Pandemic has created a number of critical issues that are presenting a multiplicity of widespread hardships for millions of Americans beyond the deadly impact of the virus infection itself.

We now have more than 50 million Americans that are suffering from food insecurity. You ask what is food insecurity? Food insecurity means that all of these people do not have a consistent and reliable access to a sufficient quantity of affordable nutritious food daily. That 50 million number of food insecure people translates into 1 in 6 people who are now food insecure. Latest statistics now show that 40% of all the food pantry volunteers are food insecure. They now have to rely on those organizations where they were volunteering and are the newest group of people in need of food.

Prior to this Pandemic, food insecurity affected 1 in 50 or roughly 8 million people. We as DePaul Alums can and should try to help make a difference by supporting local or national food pantries.

I would like to share with you someone who is making a difference. Alumni Board member Derek Guide, Class of '99 is doing just that. He called me and we discussed his idea of starting a Class of '99 Food Drive with a local food pantry. I asked if I could donate and I am happy to be a part of his Class initiative. Together we can make a significant difference for many of these food insecure people that shouldn't have to face this alone without our help.

On Wednesday, November 25th, John McKenna took his final jog out onto Alumni Field as the Spartans Head Football Coach. After 16 years at the helm Coach Mac, will lead the school in a different way, as our Athletic Director.

Coach Mac has been a larger than life figure on the staff since the late 90s. Hired by Coach Lennon as an assistant, it was



only fitting that in 2005 Coach Lennon would hand the program over entirely to Coach Mac.

In his 16 years as the Head Coach of the Spartans, McKenna has made his mark. He led the program head first into the Big North United Division, which has often been touted as one of the most competitive in the country. He won 5 State Championships in less than 10 years. He developed young men of character on and off the field. And most importantly, perhaps, he never forgot about the foundation, and the tradition, of those that came before him. John McKenna is a Spartan in the truest sense of the term.

Tonight, Coach McKenna joins the Mt. Rushmore of DePaul Catholic Head Football Coaches - and there have only been a handful of them in the school's 64 years - Coach Keil, Coach Jones, Coach Lennon, and now, Coach McKenna.

We thank the entire McKenna family, his wife, Kim, his daughters, Sloan and Kailey, and his son, Shaye, for the dedication that they have given to the Spartan Community over the years.

Finally, Coach Mac, thank you. Thank you for being a Spartan. Thank you for believing in the tradition. Thank you for guiding these young men. And thank you for smiling... even if it was just once in a while.
