## I was able to accomplish the possible because my coach had demanded the impossible.



## Teen Hunger Summit

On Tuesday, December 4, a group of DePaul Catholic students traveled to Seton Hall Prep for the annual Teen Hunger Summit presented by the Community Food Bank of New Jersey. This gathering discusses social issues related to hunger and encourages students to take action in their own communities. This year, there were 290 students from 15 different high schools in attendance.

Mrs. Dacles, Mrs. Bullman and Mr. O'Connor accompanied the students from the European History and Holocaust and Genocide classes to a viewing of the 25th Anniversary of "Schindler's List" in Paramus on December 5th. This special event was made possible through a grant from a partnership of the USC Shoah Foundation and Facing History and Ourselves.

The student response after experiencing this film has been profound. Upon returning to DePaul, Mrs. Dacles led the students through a series of questions and discussions. The students said they were deeply impacted by "man's inhumanity to man" as depicted in the film. They had studied the events leading up to the Holocaust and they recognized how well the film displayed the results of anti-Semitism. When asked if this is still a relevant concern in the world today, the students emphatically replied that "if we don't confront the problems of racism, anti-Semitism and hate in the world today, we run the risk of repeating history."
